**T**WO OF Indiana's finest amateur shotmakers hail from Evansville. Bob Mayes of Helfrich Hills and Dr. R. R. Acre of the Country club stroked their way into the championship flight of the forty-first annual State tournament. Each carded 154s for the 36 hole qualifying test over the hilly layout. The qualifying score was 155, as predicted by this column Sunday.

Mayes will play Sonny Shelby, of Lebanon, one of the five junior golfers to qualify, at 7:30 o'clock (Evansville time), in a first round match tomorrow morning. Shelby qualified with 151. He is president of the State Junior association.

Dr. Acre will match shots with Henry Timbrook, Columbus, at 8:10 o'clock. Timbrook, state junior champion in 1940 and runner-up in the recent Tri-State at Evansville, got under the wire with a 151 total, the result of an opening round 73 and 78 today. Mayes shot an 80 today to go with his 74 of the first round. He was out in 44, eight over par, this morning, but shot nine straight pars on the back nine for a par 36. Acre was out in par 36 and back in 39 for a 75 today.

Francis Fleming was just one shot shy with a 156 total. He had a 76 today to go with a first round 80. It was the second straight year for Fleming to miss the elite class by one shot. He had some mighty tough breaks the first round.
