I, Nancy BIRD of the State of North Carolina and County of Alamance do this 5th day of April 1858 make and publish this my last will & testament hereby revoking & making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.

And first I direct my body be decently interred in the burying ground at the Cross Road Church.

And as to such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to intrust me with I dispose of the same as follows

First, I give to Martha McCADAM, wife of Eli McCADAM two negro girls one by the name of Nancy the other by the name Patience

And my Executor sell the balance of my negroes at probate sale but not to negro traders and all the balance of my property at probate sale on a reasonable credit

And my desire is that my Executor purchase Tomb Stones & set up at the graves of my sisters Jane HAMILTON, Elizabeth WALKER, Margaret McOLLOCH & my dead husband Thos. BIRD & to pay for them out of the proceeds of my property & also to my

I give to the following persons & their heirs the following legacies (?)

To David BRADFORD three hundred dollars

To Empson BIRD one hundred & fifty dollars

To Thomas BIRD one hundred & fifty dollars

To Thomas B WHITHEAD (?) one hundred dollars

To give to my niece Elizabeth PICKET four hundred dollars and should Elizabeth Douglas be living at my death I give to her one hundred & fifty dollars, and to each of my slaves I give the sum of five dollars and should there be a balance remaining after paying as directed above and the payments of my debts and also paying my Executor five per centum on all sums collected and five per centum all sums paid out as _____ or distribution shares and _____ & debts that the remaining balance be equally divided between the following persons or their heirs (Viz.)

DICKEY, Albert B., Springs Valley Herald (March 28, 1929) Death Notice A. B. Dickey, a former resident of West Baden, died at the home of his niece in Bloomington last Tuesday, March 26th, after a paralytic stroke. The body was removed from Bloomington to West Baden by ambulance Thursday and services were conducted at the Methodist Church Thursday afternoon at 1:30. Mr. Dickey was 80 years, 11 months and 21 days old at the time of his death. He was well known and loved by a number of friends as he was associated with so many different people when he carried the rural mail out of West Baden for a number of years. The entire community extends their sympathy to the grieved children. The wife and one daughter have preceded him in death. Those of the children surviving

are L. S. Dickey of West Baden; James, of Detroit; Orpheus of Shoals; Bruce of Cleveland; Clarence, of Bloomington and one daughter, Mrs. Olive Wycoff, of Mitchell, Ind. Also he leaves a number of grandchildren and other relatives and friends.

Interment was held at the Southern cemetery.

Albert B. Dickey, son of Duncan and Almeda Dickey, was born in Northwest Township, Orange County, Indiana, April 5th, 1847. In the township in which he was born he grew to manhood and lived continuously for fifty years, with the exception of one years he lived in Seneca, Kansas. With the exception of one year, he has been a resident of Orange County eighty-two years. His father went to California in 1850 and died there, leaving a wife an four children. Albert being the oldest son, naturally shared with the mother much of the cares of family.

When sixteen years of age, he answered his County's call and enlisted in Company F. of the 17th Indiana Volunteers. After the close of the war, he went to school at old Smith Schoolhouse near where he was born. He also attended Normal School at Orleans, and under the wise leadership of Professor John M. Bloss, he prepared himself to teach school and for many years was one of the most efficient teachers of Orange County.

In 1868 he was married to Celia S. Southern. To this union were born eight children. Orpheus M. of Shoals, Ind.; Alice Wycoff of Mitchell, Ind.; Mary, who departed this life at the age of twenty four years; James A. of Detroit, Mich.; Maggie, whose brief life ended with two summers; Leonard S, of West Baden, Ind.; Bruce A. of Cleveland, Ohio; and Clarence L. of Bloomington, Indiana. Brother Dickey was happily converted at Bonds Chapel. After he was married he erected a family altar. He was active in church work. He was one of the trustees that help built Faucetts Chapel. In May, 1890, a shadow fell upon his pathway that never was lifted. The wife of his youth went away and left him and seven children to mourn. When he moved to West Baden, he was elected as trustee of the M. E. Church and was active in the erection of the new church. He was a member of the Bazil Decker Post of the Grand Army of the Republic at West Baden, Indiana, He was a born patriot, a highly respected citizen, a model husband, an affectionate indulgent father; earth never bore upon its bosom a better friend. For the past two years, he has been a constant sufferer and for eighteen months he has been confined to his room, a helpless invalid. during his long suffering, he has been patient and resigned. He took sick at the home of his niece, Mrs. Eva Atwater in Bloomington. In this home, Mr. Atwater and wife did all they could do to relieve the suffering of Brother Dickey. He who said that a cup of water given in the name of a Disciple shall not lose its reward will certainly reward these relatives and friends. Tuesday, March 26th, the soldier who answered the roll call on the tented field and weary march answered to the roll call of Heaven and was mustered out and pitched his tent in Fame's eternal camping ground. May God bless the church he loved so well and may his mantle fall upon his children's children. If he had lived until the 5th of April he would have been eighty-two years old.

Funeral services were held at the M. E. Church in West Baden, Indiana. The Reverend John M. Walker of Evansville, Indiana, former superintendent of New Albany district, preached the funeral. A large audience attended the service. The floral offerings were many. Interment was at the old Southern cemetery six miles north of West Baden. Reverend Montgomery, his pastor, officiated at the grace and pronounced the benediction and the mortal remains of our brother was laid to rest to await the resurrection of the just.

Se was married to Joseph Acre of Martin Co. in 1852, and for more than 65 years they fought the battles of life together, happy in each other's companionship. To them were born eight children, Joshua, Frank B. and Charles of WaKeeney, KS; Albert B. of OK; Mrs. Sarah E. Kieth of Paoli, IN; Thomas, Joseph, Emerson and Hubert L. preceded her to that Glory Land. A few years after the death of her first husband, she was married to James L. Notes for Joseph L. Acre: Obituary of Joseph L. Acre

At about 3 o'clock Sunday morning, June 13, 1897, just before dawn of that beautiful day, the spirit of Mr. Joseph Acre took its flight from the vale of tears and was borne on the pure morning air o'er the trackless path on which so many bloodwashed saints have traveled in their flight to eternal glory, there to find welcome only to those who lived in the fear of the living God.

He had been in poor health for some time and had been confined to his bed for some time. Death to him was not unexpected, neither was it feared. Mr. Acre was nearly 68 years of age. He was born in Orange County, IN, in 1829, and moved to this neighborhood when a mere child, and remained here until he was called by the Father who doeth all things well.

Mr. Acre was united in marriage to Caroline D. Hamilton in 1859; to them nine children were born, eight boys and one girl, three of whom preceded him to his final home.
